




Reminders and Information

Nut Free School	A quick reminder that The Meads is a nut free school . This includes if children are bringing treats into school to give to their friends for birthdays (for example Celebrations and Quality Street) - please ensure that the treats are nut free also.	
Bicycles	If your child brings a bicycle into school, please can you ensure that the bike is locked up securely. Any bicycles left in school are at owner's risk.	
Parking	Polite reminder to parents to please be mindful of where you are parking during the school run. Please do not block residents driveways and park in no parking zones.	
Attendance	As a whole school our target for attendance is to be above 96% every week. We use a traffic light system to monitor attendance for each class. Dark Green = 100%, Light Green = 99%-96%, Yellow = 95%-90%, Red = Below 90%. Please be aware that the Education Welfare Officer will monitor low attendance; and will also take into consideration patterns in attendance with regards to siblings and cousins.


